K-2 Newsletter

Reading/ELA

In January we will begin our unit on Word Detectives. In this unit, students will learn strategies to figure out new vocabulary and tricky words as their books begin to get more challenging. Students will learn strategies to use during reading to figure out new or unknown words.

Writing

In January we will continue our unit on informational writing. We will continue writing All About Books about a topic that we know a lot about. We will use what we know about nonfiction text and nonfiction text features to write books. We will continue to stretch out words in order to spell, write our sight words, and make sure we use the correct punctuation. We will be finishing this unit at the end of January.

Science

In January we will finish our unit on animal and plant defenses. In this unit, students learned about animal and plant structures and what animals and plants need to do to survive. We will also begin our next unit on Light and Sound. In this unit, students will act as light and sound engineers as they are asked to design, build, and then project a scene for a puppet show. As light engineers, they will have to answer the question; how do we make different parts of a surface brighter or darker? Students will be investigating cause-and-effect relationships.

Social Studies

In January, first graders will finish learning about how families and communities are important. Students will begin their next unit on families now and long ago. In this unit students will learn about life long ago and make comparisons to how life is today. Second graders will finish learning about our community's geography and begin learning about New York City overtime. In this unit students will explore New York City long ago. Kindergarteners will finish learning about school and the school community and begin the next unit on individual development and cultural identity. In this unit students will learn how people are the same and different across America.



Math

In January, kindergarteners will be continuing to learn about addition and how to put together numbers. Also, students will learn how to act it out, how to model addition, how to draw addition problems, and how to write and solve addition sentences. Students will also be learning about subtraction. Students will begin to learn about how to take apart a number and how to draw a picture to solve subtraction problems. Students will also be learning about how to write subtraction sentences and learning how addition and subtraction connect or relate to each other (For example: $2+3=5$ and $5-3=2$).

In January, first graders will be learning about addition and subtraction relationships. Students will practice addition and subtraction strategies. Students will also learn about related facts and how to identify related facts (Example: $2+5=7$ or $5+2=7$ and $7-5=2$ or $7-2=5$). Students will also learn how to choose the correct operation (addition or subtraction) and how to solve addition and subtraction word problems. Students will also begin learning about how to count and model numbers. Students will learn how to count by ones and by tens (Example: 10, 20, 30, 40...). Students will learn how to model numbers as tens and ones (Example: 24 is 2 tens and 4 ones). Also, students will continue to solve word problems involving these numbers.

In January, second graders will be learning two-digit subtraction using regrouping. Students will learn different strategies to help them solve subtraction problems. Students will also solve word problems that involve two-digit subtraction. Additionally, students will learn how to solve three-digit addition and subtraction problems. Using what they learned about regrouping (when you can make a ten in the ones place), students will learn how to regroup in the ones place, tens place, and hundreds place when solving problems with three-digits. Students will also learn how to draw numbers with hundreds, tens, and ones using base-ten blocks.

Word Study

We will be doing a variety of activities during word study. We will be practicing our letters and letter sounds to build a strong phonetic (letter-sound) foundation. We will also learn how to spell words by using all that we know about letter sounds. We will continue to practice writing sight words and learn new vocabulary words. We will engage in activities such as writing words in ABC order and writing words in sentences.
