K-2 Newsletter

Reading/ELA

We will be working on becoming stronger and more independent readers. Students will learn to build reading habits and use strategies during reading. Students will learn how to become better readers by using strategies to figure out tricky words. Students will practice reading in a small group and in partnerships.

Writing

We will be working on discovering and capturing small moments, which we will turn into big stories. We will also be working on rewriting and revising our stories to create strong beginnings and endings. Students will practice using sequence words such as first, then, next, after, last, and finally. Students will practice adding details to their stories by making their characters move, feel, and talk.

Science

Our science unit begins by learning about animal and plant defenses. In this unit, students will be taking on the role as scientists who need to help an aquarium director instruct other children on how a sea turtle will be safe to go back into the ocean where she came from. By the end of the unit, students will be able to use ideas of structures and function to explain how a wide variety of animals and plants and their offspring defend themselves in order to survive. Students will be learning about what plants and animals need to survive and how plants and animals meet their needs.



Social Studies

Our social studies unit begins by learning about how families and communities are important. Students will think why families are important and how they influence who we are. Students will also make the connection between families and communities to understand the importance of traditions, values, customs, languages, and how they influence one another.

Math

For kindergarteners, students will learn how to compare numbers to 5. Students will learn how to identify the same numbers, how to identify numbers that are greater than, and how to identify numbers that are less than. Students will also learn how to represent, count, and write numbers 6 to 9. Students will model and count 6 to 9 by using objects and drawings.

For first graders, students will learn about subtraction concepts. Students will learn how to solve subtraction problems by using pictures. Students will also learn how to subtract zero and how to subtract 10 or less. Students will also learn about addition strategies. Students will learn how to add in any order, how to count on, how to add doubles (example: $4+4=8$), how to make a ten to add, and how to add 3 numbers together.

For second graders, students will also learn about numbers to 1,000. Students will learn how to model and write 3-digit numbers. Students will also learn about place value and how to show numbers in different ways. Students will also learn about basic facts and relationships. Students will learn doubles facts (example: $4+4=8$). Students will learn to add 3 addends (numbers) together. Students will learn how to draw pictures to represent problems, how to make a ten, and how to use a ten to add and subtract.



Word Study:

We will be doing a variety of activities during word study. We will be practicing our letters and letter sounds to build a strong phonetic (letter-sound) foundation. We will also learn how to spell words by using all that we know about letter sounds. We will continue to practice writing sight words and learn new vocabulary words. We will engage in activities such as writing words in ABC order and writing words in sentences.
